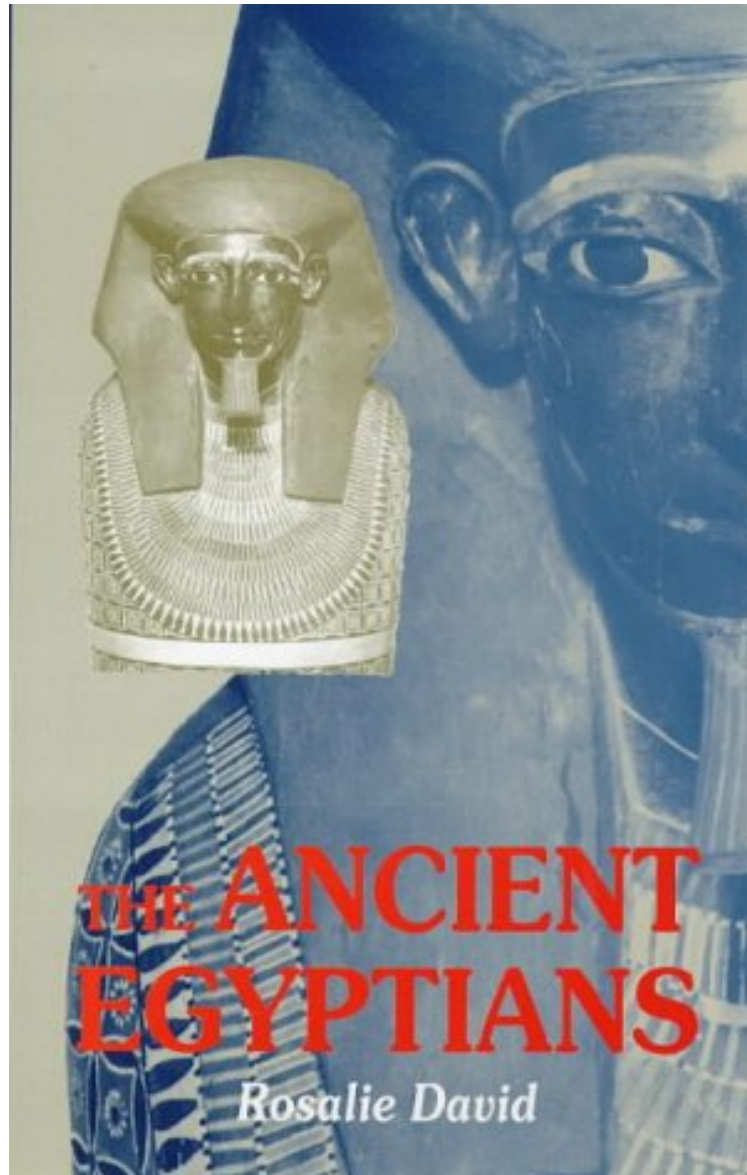

This clearly written book provides in its first section a historical account of the ancient Egyptian beliefs from the Predynastic Period to the New Kingdom. The author gives a description of the political and religious situation in each period. The cosmogonies, funerary customs, literature and the role of religion are clearly detailed. The last two parts of this work offer excellent primary and secondary bibliographic sources, as well as a list of the most important religious sites in Egypt. This is an excellent reference for students and experts in the field of Egyptology.

This updated and fully revised second edition contains a new selection of plates and illustrations. The book traces the evolution of religious beliefs and practices within the historical and political contexts of the main periods of Egypt's civilization. It shows how historical and political events influenced state cults, temple rituals and funerary practices and emphasises how religion permeated most aspects of everyday life, including law, medicine and education. The book describes how some religious customs have even survived, in different forms, until the present day. Contains extensive bibliographies of primary and secondary sources.

A readable introduction to the main themes: creation myths and solar beliefs, priesthood and ritual, Osiris and the theology of kingship, architecture and iconography set into the context of Egyptian history as it develops over two and a half millennia.
