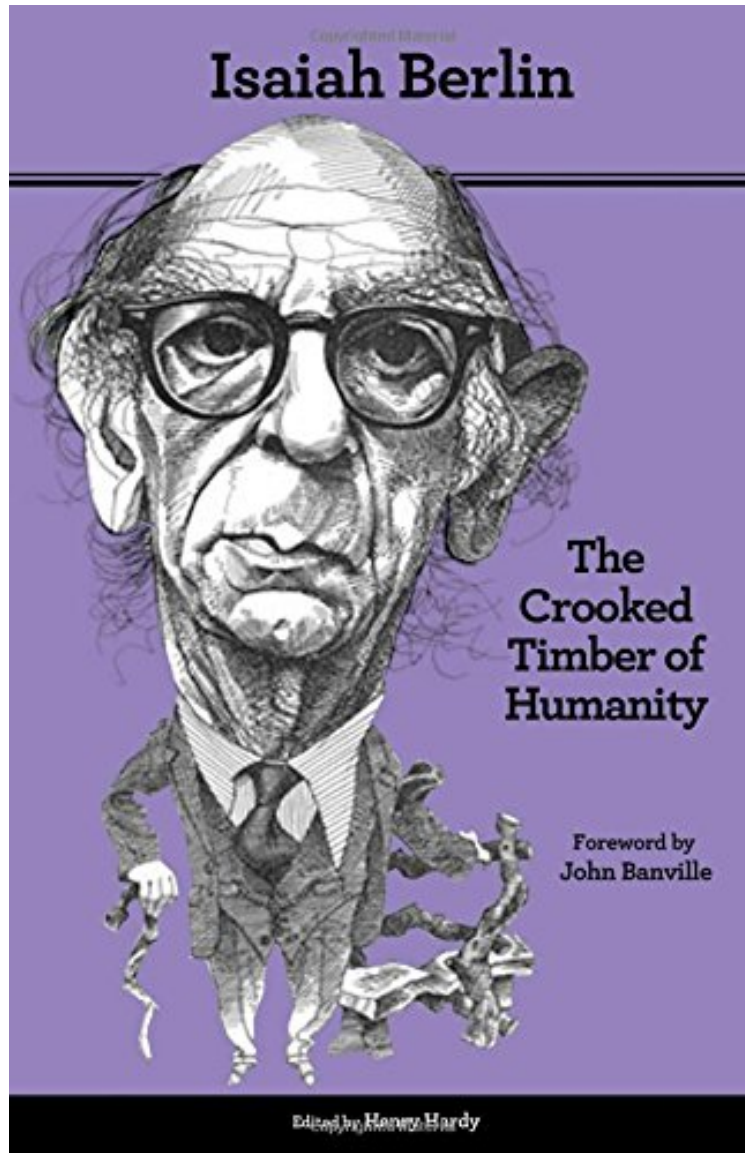

In addition to his wit and wisdom, he provides political insights and a record of diplomatic history that rivals the learned tomes of Judd, Hobsbawm and Toynbee.
